COMMON SIGNS

Common road signs and markings that you may come across when cycling through the city

Advanced stop lines
Advanced stop lines enable cyclists to negotiate junctions safely. When the traffic signals are red, cyclists move ahead to a 'reservoir' area to position themselves safely ahead of motorists.
